SOLICITATION AND NOTICE FOR BIDS

Sealed Bids for **Broken Arrow Public Schools Options Academy Interior Renovation** will be received and publicly opened and read aloud. Bids will be received by the INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER THREE OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA, hereinafter referred to as "Owner," in the Education Service Center, 701 S. Main Street, Broken Arrow, OK 74012 until **10:00 am, Tuesday, October 1st, 2024**.

The bidding process will be in compliance with the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974. Bids must be accompanied by a bid security in the amount of 5% of the bid if the bid equals or exceeds \$50,000. By this notice, all provisions of the act apply to this project and are incorporated into the notice by reference.

Upon receipt of an acceptable bid, the contract will be awarded within thirty days after the opening of bids.

A pre-bid conference will be held at the BA Options Academy site at 2:00 PM on Wednesday, September 18th, 2024. Attendance at this conference is not mandatory.

The owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive informalities or minor irregularities in any bid.



INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Receipt and Opening of Bids:

Lowry Construction Services, Inc. (herein called Construction Manager) acting as Construction Manager for Broken Arrow Public Schools, Independent District 3, an Agency of the State of Oklahoma, (herein called the "Owner"), invites bids on the form attached hereto, all blanks of which must be appropriately filled in.

All bids shall be sealed closed and delivered to the Owner at the following address:

In submitting the bid, it is understood that the right is reserved by the Construction Manager to reject any and all bids, and it is agreed that this bid may not be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days after the date of closing of same.

If the bid is for \$50,000 or more, it shall be accompanied by a certified check or a cashier's check made payable to Lowry Construction Services, Inc. or a Corporate Surety Bond of a surety company duly authorized to do business in the State of Oklahoma, in the sum of five percent (5%) of the total amount of the bid (unless otherwise specified in the bid documents which is submitted as bid security, conditioned upon the Bidder's entering into a contract with Lowry Construction Services, Inc. in accordance with the terms of the bid.

2. Proposal Due Date and Time:

4. Preparation of Bid:

a. Each bid proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form. All blank spaces for bid prices must be filled in, in both words and figures.



- b. Bidder shall submit proposals using the prescribed forms referenced in this document.
- c. Bidders must deposit with each bid, security in the amount and form and subject to all conditions provided for in the Instruction to Bidders. Bidders must also submit with each bid an affidavit disclosing certain business affiliations and a non-collusion affidavit. This submission must be in accordance with state law.
- d. Bid shall be delivered in a sealed envelope clearly marked with Project Name, Name of Bidder and Bid Package Number.
- e. The following documents are to be attached to and made a condition of the bid. Fill out all forms completely and include any notarizations and seals required:
 - 1) Scope Package Bid Form
 - 2) Required bid security in the form of (bond, check, 5% of bid if bid of \$50,000 or more)
 - 3) Business Relationship Affidavit.
 - 4) Non-collusion Affidavit.
 - 5) Non-Kickback Affidavit.
 - 6) Felony Compliance Affidavit.
 - 7) Resident and Non-Resident Business Registration and Licensing Affidavit.

5. Qualifications of Bidder:

The Owner or Construction Manager may make such investigations as they deem necessary to determine ability of the bidder to perform the work, and the bidder shall furnish to the Owner or Construction Manager all such information and data for this purpose as the Owner or Construction Manager may request. The Owner or Construction Manager reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, such bidder fails to satisfy the Owner or Construction Manager that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligation of the Agreement for Construction and to complete the work contemplated therein. Conditional bids shall not be accepted.

6. Bid Security:

Each bid of \$50,000 or more must be accompanied by certified check of the bidder, or a bid bond duly executed by the bidder as principal and having as surety thereof a surety company approved by the Owner or Construction Manager, in the amount of five percent (5%) of the bid. Such certified checks or bid bonds will be returned to all except the three lowest bidders within three (3) days after the bid opening, and the remaining checks or bid bonds will be returned promptly after the Owner or Construction Manager and the accepted bidder have executed the Agreement for Construction, or, if no award has been made within sixty (60) days after the date of the opening of bids, upon demand of the bidder at any time thereafter, so long as he has not been notified of the acceptance of his bid.



7. Liquidated Damages for Failure to Enter into the Agreement for Construction:

The successful bidder, upon his failure or refusal to execute and deliver the Agreement for Construction and bonds required within ten (10) days after he has received notice of the acceptance of his bid, shall forfeit to the Owner or Construction Manager, as liquidated damages for such failure or refusal, the security deposited with his bid.

8. Conditions of Work:

Each bidder must inform himself fully of the conditions relating to construction of the Project and the employment of labor thereon. While the drawings and specifications are intended to indicate the physical scope of the project, each bidder is encouraged to closely examine the site in order to determine the most precise quantities of labor and material required to complete the project. Failure to do so will not relieve a successful bidder of his obligation to furnish all material and labor necessary to carry out the provisions of his Agreement. As far as possible the Contractor, in carrying out his work, must employ such methods or means as will not cause any interruption of or interference with the work of any other Contractor.

It is understood and agreed that the work shall be completed and performed according to the true intent, meaning and spirit of the Contract documents, and should anything be omitted from the Contract documents, which are intended to cover all work necessary to complete the project in a first-class workmanlike manner, then the Contractor shall secure written instructions from the Construction Manager before proceeding with the work affected or to be affected by such omissions and discrepancies.

9. Addenda and Interpretations:

No interpretation of the meaning of plans, specifications or other pre-bid documents will be made to any bidder orally. Every request for such interpretation should be in writing, via email to Jesse Patrick, Lowry Construction Services, jessie@lowrycs.com, and to be given consideration, must be received <u>no later than 5:00 pm on September 27th, 2024</u>. Any and all such interpretations and supplemental instructions will be in the form of a written addenda to the specification which, not later than three (3) working days prior to date fixed for opening of bids. Failure of any bidder to receive any such addendum or interpretation shall not relieve such bidder from any obligation under his bid as submitted. All addenda so issued shall become part of the Contract documents.

10. <u>Security for Faithful Performance</u>:

Simultaneously with delivery of the executed Agreement for Construction the Contractor shall furnish a surety bond or bonds as security for faithful performance of this Agreement, for the payments of all persons performing labor on the project under this Agreement and furnishing materials in connection with this Agreement, and for defects in materials and workmanship. The surety on such bond or bonds shall be a duly authorized surety company satisfactory to the Owner or Construction Manager and licensed to do business in the State of Oklahoma.

11. Power of Attorney:

Attorneys-in-fact who sign bid bonds or Contract bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their power of attorney.

12. <u>Laws and Regulations</u>:

Owasso Public Schools and Construction Manager are committed to all applicable Oklahoma statutes, and the bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable federal laws, state laws, municipal ordinances, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over construction of the project shall apply to the Agreement for Construction throughout, and they will be deemed to be included in the Agreement for Construction the same as though herein written out in full.



13. Small, Small Disadvantaged, and Female-owned Business Enterprise Participation:

It is the goal of Owasso Public Schools and the Construction Manager to diversify the pool of contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, consultants and other vendors who provide goods and services related to construction projects. To help achieve this objective, contractors are encouraged to exert equal opportunity efforts to identify and locate small, small disadvantaged and female-owned business enterprises to participate as subcontractors and material suppliers for construction projects. In order for Owasso Public Schools to monitor progress in this area, the successful contractor may be required to provide a list of all subcontracts and major material purchase orders issued to firms which are certified as such and which will provide goods or services for this project.

14. <u>Sales Tax Exemption</u>:

All bids must be submitted exclusive of Federal Excise Tax and Oklahoma State Sales Tax. Owasso Public Schools is exempt from Oklahoma State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax.

15. Obligation of Bidder:

At the time of the opening of bids each bidder will be presumed to have inspected the site and to have read and be thoroughly familiar with the Plans and Contract Documents (including all addenda). The failure or omission of any bidder to examine any form, instrument or document shall in no way relieve any bidder from any obligation in respect of his bid. Bidder must agree to commence work on a date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" of the Construction Manager and to fully complete the project within the number of days specified in the bid schedule.

16. Time of Completion:

Bidder must agree to commence work on a date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" and to substantially complete the project in accordance with the date(s) included in the Lowry Construction Services, Inc. project schedule.



Includes, but is not limited to, providing all the necessary labor, materials, tools, supplies, supervision, insurance, equipment, scaffolding, hoisting, fees, etc. necessary to provide the **Mechanical Work for the Broken Arrow Public Schools Options Academy Interior Renovation**, Broken Arrow, Oklahoma in accordance with the Contract Documents. It is further understood and agreed that this Subcontract also includes the furnishing and installation of the below listed items regardless of whether or not they are in the listed specification section(s) or any other specification section(s) or shown on the plans. This scope listing is to be used as a guideline and should not be considered as an all-inclusive list of items required to provide a complete scope of work under this proposal. Drawing and detail references are provided for reference only and are not to be considered as all-inclusive of Contract Documents for the particular items referenced. (**Please note: The word "provide" when used herein shall mean furnish and install completely, including all costs for labor, materials, equipment, hoisting, layout, scaffolding, ladders, staging, tools, rigging and any other appurtenances necessary to complete the Work".**)

- 1. Provide all required demolition as indicated for this scope of work. Removal shall be back to the source if possible.
- Remove any HVAC equipment required to be salvaged and turn over to Owner as directed by the Construction Manager.
- 3. Disconnect and make safe all required ductwork and any required refrigerant lines as required for demolition. Refer to demolition drawings.
- Provide complete Division 23 Mechanical systems including but not limited to all HVAC ductwork, hydronic pressure piping or refrigerant piping as required for all areas designated for construction.
- 5. Provide all sheet metal, return/supply and exhaust air devices, vanes, registers, grilles, duct silencers and diffusers.
- 6. Provide and install smoke detectors as indicated.
- 7. Provide all mechanical equipment including VAV's, FCU's, exhaust fans, unit heaters, booster fans, inline fans, dampers, grilles, louvers, and other misc. mechanical equipment.
- 8. Provide relocation of all mechanical equipment as indicated.
- 9. Provide all HVAC temperature control and instrumentation work complete (turnkey) including all, raceways, low and line voltage circuitry, control interlocks and miscellaneous control wiring (power supply circuitry by Division 26). All control wiring to be in raceways as required including all in-wall drops from above finished ceiling to wall mounted T-stats or sensors.



- 10. Provide demolition and relocation of thermostats if required.
- 11. Provide all vibration isolation controls as indicated.
- 12. Include temporary supporting of all HVAC items that are to stay and reinstall once grid is installed.
- 13. Cover duct openings during painting.
- 14. Modify duct in renovation areas as required for a complete system.
- 15. Provide temporary filters for all units during construction including changing of filters weekly or as required to ensure the units operate at Manufacturer recommended efficiency levels.
- 16. Install temporary filters on all return air vents and cover all open ducts during demo as well as drywall/ paint.
- 17. Provide all specified insulation for systems installed under this subcontract.
- 18. Provide all pipe insulation.
- 19. Provide all refrigerant, refrigerant piping.
- 20. Provide all fire, fire/smoke and smoke dampers required for ductwork penetrations through fire rated and smoke rated walls. Coordinate device monitoring connections with fire alarm contractor.
- 21. Provide all required motorized dampers.
- Provide and coordinate all HVAC services and provide final connect all Owner furnished equipment and all items furnished under other trade sections.
- 23. Subcontractor agrees to review electrical drawings and ensure that all power requirements for the work included in this subcontract are met. Subcontractor to notify Lowry Construction Services in writing of any electrical requirements which have not been shown on these drawings prior to the start of the work of this subcontract.
- 24. Provide all required fire stops, firesafing, fire caulking, sealing and grouting of all floor, wall, ceiling, and roof penetrations as required by this scope of work.
- 25. Provide caulking and sealing of all work provided by this subcontract. Include escutcheons and/or finish caulking of all materials in exposed areas to adjacent surfaces.
- 26. Provide all miscellaneous metal and steel items for support of HVAC items of work including but not limited to hangers, protective appurtenances, platforms, plates, sleeves, embedded items, unistrut, steel angle or channel, bolts, rods and straps.
- 27. Provide labels, stencils, tags, warning tape and similar pipe identification relative to the work of this subcontract.
- 28. Provide touch-up painting of any damaged pre-finished equipment.
- Provide all required access panels or architectural cover plates as required for the execution of this work (All access panels will be installed by the ceiling or wall contractor).
- 30. Provide all cutting, patching and repair of concrete, drywall and masonry if Subcontractor's work is not installed ahead of other trades. All costs to cut/patch/repair this work will be borne by this Subcontractor.
- 31. Subcontractor shall participate in a formal coordination process with other subcontractors (primarily the Plumbing, Fire Suppression, and Electrical Trades) in order to determine the final routing for all systems. Lowry Construction Services, nor the design team, will be providing models for use by Subcontractors. If the Subcontractor elects to use 3D BIM coordination for this process, the subcontractor may be required to model architectural and structural elements if needed at their own expense and risk. If agreed by all parties that 3D BIM coordination will be used, Lowry Construction Services will help oversee and manage the process to ensure all parties participate in the coordination process.
- 32. Coordinate and cooperate with fire protection, plumbing, and electrical subcontractors at tight/congested overhead spaces. Piping may require offsets or relocation so it does not cover up any existing or new electrical junction boxes or block access to other work as performed by others. Coordinate and locate or relocate pipe locations so as not to be inaccessible above other's work required to have maintenance access.
- 33. Provide all testing and balancing of HVAC systems.
- 34. Provide all performance and acceptance testing. Subcontractor to provide all labor, materials, supervision and equipment to facilitate the testing of all work of this subcontract.
- 35. Provide start-up for all equipment. Include manufacturer's start-up of equipment if required by the equipment manufacturer. Subcontractor must provide a pre-functional start-up checklist and verify all items have been completed by other trades prior to factory personnel being onsite for start-up activities.
- Provide all necessary local and state trade permits, test and inspection fees as required for the performance of this subcontractor's work.
- 37. Provide training for all systems, components and equipment for the owner's building operations team.

GENERAL ITEMS

- 1. Include separate mobilizations / demobilizations as required by the Project Schedule.
- Provide all shop drawings, product data, samples and other pertinent submittals for the work of this Subcontract. Provide engineering
 and printing costs for all shop drawings, coordination drawings, and product submittals for architect approval as required to properly
 coordinate the work included in this Subcontract with other trades. Include costs for revising and resubmitting shop/ coordination
 drawings as needed.
- Subcontractor will assist LCS with providing material quantities and cost breakdowns as required for the Owner's and LCS's budget requirements.
- Contractor shall provide a complete installation that complies with all applicable codes, ordinances and satisfying all Authorities Having Jurisdiction.



- 5. Subcontractor will have to register for a contractors license with the City of Broken Arrow.
- 6. Provide all field engineering and layout from benchmarks and base building control (benchmarks and baseline control is furnished by others). This Subcontractor is responsible for replacement of any damaged benchmarks, base line control or layout work of other trades/packages damaged or destroyed by the work of this work package.
- 7. Provide all required pedestrian protection, traffic control and protection including flagman, barricades, signage, etc. as required for the work, and as may be required for protection for equipment access, deliveries and loading.
- 8. Subcontractor is required to comply with requirements to control Dust and Airborne Contaminants. No waste materials or debris shall be allowed to accumulate.
- 9. Contractor is responsible for all related pumping, bailing, discharge and maintenance thereof including temporary drainage requirements for control of run-off and the prevention of ponding and repair to resulting damaged sub-grades.
- 10. Provide coordination, assistance, and necessary access for the Owner's furnished Testing Laboratory, including notification, obtaining samples and data gathering as required for scope of work. Costs for retesting due to failed tests and/or for Subcontractor's unpreparedness, will be paid by this Subcontractor.
- 11. It is mutually understood and agreed that this subcontractor will coordinate all of the scheduled deliveries of these items being furnished by others with the LCS designated representative. This includes the on or off site storage, staging, inventory control, and shipping to the site. All damages or shortages are to be reported within 24 hours of delivery.

- 1. Provide electrical power and lighting systems for complete, operable, and code compliant systems.
- 2. Provide low voltage system requirements as outlined per the electrical drawings and specifications.
- 3. Provide access control system requirements as outlined in the electrical drawings and specifications.
- 4. Provide fire alarm system requirements as outlined per the electrical drawings and specifications.
- 5. Provide telephone and data system requirements as noted, but not limited to requirements in E402.
- Provide all required local, State and Federal trade permits and pay required fees as required for the performance of this subcontractor's work.
- 7. Disconnect and make safe all required electrical systems for demolition work. Coordinate with demolition drawings.
- 8. Include all required demolition as indicated for this scope of work. Removal shall be back to the source if possible.
- 9. Remove any existing light fixtures shown to be salvaged and turn over to Owner as directed by Construction Manager.
- 10. Provide all high, medium, low, and control voltage raceways, conduit, wire ways, boxes, pull strings, etc. complete. Provide medium and high voltage conductors and cabling.
- 11. Provide all substations, switchboards, transformers (high and low voltage), switchgear, switchboards, power distribution panels, bus assemblies, panel boards, wiring devices, switches, circuit breakers, fuses, receptacles, etc. complete.
